Rabbi Ilana Schachter Reform Services

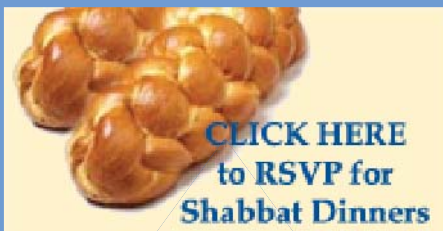
